No Mess, No Fuss Appliqué

Jacobean Quilt Project – Beginner/Intermediate Skills

Class meets one Monday per month, creating blocks in the following order: January Block # 1, February Block # 12, March Block # 15, April Block # 7, May Block # 4, June Block # 9, July Block #6, August Block # 19, September Block # 14, October Block # 11, November(1) Block #18, November(2) Block # 16, January 2012 Medallion Block. As there is no December class, 2 blocks will be done in the November class.

January class: We will go through your appliqué fabrics to select the best ones for this project. During the last hour of the class, we will go shopping at Quilt Patch to buy additional fabrics.

Appliqué Fabric:

Purchase fat quarters or 1/3 yard cuts of appliqué fabrics. See pictures in book for color suggestions. **100% cotton is "user-friendly" while polyester blends are to be avoided if possible.**

Other Fabrics: See attached supply list (page 2) of fabrics for the quilt

<u>Background fabric</u> – 3 yards for blocks <u>or</u> buy 6 yards if including a border of same fabric. 1 yard for center medallion (may be same or different). **See page 2 for detailed explanation about yardages**. Try to choose a light colored (white, beige, tan, etc.) fabric. <u>DO NOT use a dark</u> <u>background fabric for this method</u>. Tone-on-tone works nicely, but <u>do not</u> get fabric where you can "feel" the pattern. This is harder to needle by hand.

Threads:

<u>*Match thread colors to your appliqué fabric</u>. 100 weight silk thread or 60 weight spools of machine embroidery thread (not the shiny kind).

__*A light colored hand quilting thread. If you do not have any, buy YLI bright goldenrod.

Other Supplies:


- Book "The Best of Jacobean Applique" by Patricia Campbell. See my site for the link.
- *Scissors, straight pins, thimble (optional), etc.
- *Size 10 Milliners needles (Richard Hemming brand is very good).
- *Size 10 "sharps" needles (Richard Hemming brand is very good).
- *One THICK-line <u>blue</u> wash-out fabric marking pen, such as Mark-B-Gone.
- ____*Medium sized cutting mat, ruler, and rotary cutter.

Pre-class instructions:

____Wash and press <u>all</u> fabrics before class to remove sizing, pre-shrink fabric, and test for color fastness.

____Before the first class, precut the background fabric (Fabric #3) into 16" blocks. You will need 12, as indicated on the attached supply list. If you wish, you may also sew or serge a narrow finish around the edges to avoid fraying.

<u>NOTE</u>: This supply list has 2 pages.



FABRIC AND LAYOUT FOR JACOBEAN QUILT PROJECT

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Fabric #1: Trim neatly into a 32" square. Fabric #2: Cut into 2" strips, need about 20 (sashing/borders). Fabric #2: Cut into 3" strips, need about 8-9 (binding) Fabric #3: Cut into 16" blocks, need 12. Fabric #4: Cut 5 ¹/₂" strips, cut 4 lengthwise or 8 crosswise Fabric #5: Cut 8 ¹/₂" strips, cut 4 lengthwise or 8-9 crosswise
